Criteria for Eligibility

Permit Type	Initial Duration	Renewal Duration	Employer	Minimum Salary
Critical Skills Permit*	2 years	Can transition to long term residency after the initial 2 years	Irish entity	€64,000**
General Employment Permit***	3 months to 2 years	3 years	Irish entity	€30,000
Intra Company Transfer	3 months	3 years	Foreign entity	€40,000

Issued by Department of Enterprise, Trade & Employment (DETE)

Applicants cannot be in the State while permit is being processed

- Partners of Critical Skills Permit holders can work in the State without an employment permit
- Restricted availability at salaries from €32,000 €64,000
- **Requires Labour Market Needs Test**

The Process

The Employment Permits Online System (EPOS) is an online system, making it streamlined and easy to use with a faster turnaround time. A userguide is available online.



The **Trusted Partner Initiative** streamlines the employment permit application process and is aimed primarily at regular users of the employment permits regime, including companies in start-up and expansion modes.

be submitted at least 12 weeks before the proposed employment start date.

The Department of Justice also issues an Atypical Working Scheme Permission (AWS)*. This is applied for through www.irishimmigration.ie/atypical-working-scheme.

* Work permission under AWS is granted for a maximum of 90 consecutive days. This cannot be extended and only one AWS Permission will be granted in a year. AWS Permissions should only be applied for after all other employment permits issued by DETE have been considered.



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
